We have risen to the challenge in two main ways:

In the UK we reached almost 10,000 children and young people to help raise their aspirations through our growing series of personal development workshops in schools and our partnerships with charities like Outward Bound Trust, Binti and UpFront Theatre

2 In India we made a significant contribution to the Covid relief effort as the country struggled to tackle the impact of the virus, while continuing to empower women and children towards independent economic and social lives through community projects.

Twelve years and more of giving back...

The Hemraj Goyal Foundation was founded in memory of their father by the Goyal brothers who own Hallmark Care Homes in 2010.

Since then the Foundation has given almost £4 million to projects in the UK and abroad, including some **£400,000 in 2021.**

We are proud that our chair, Anita Goyal, was awarded the MBE in 2021 for her services to diversity and empowerment of women through her charity leadership.

In 2022 the Foundation aims to reach more children, young people and women in the UK and abroad through new and existing partnerships. With Working Options in Education we can offer our free personal development and life skills workshops to more schools. In India we will support more community projects empowering women, children and their families.

UpFront Theatre to tour schools in disadvantaged communities with their interactive play, In Harm's Way, on coping with mental health issues.

Outward Bound Trust to take their unique outdoors experiences into schools during Covid and their BBC appeal to enable more young people to attend their residential courses.

Cricket coaching and matches for young women and men from disadvantaged communities in East London.

A wide range of personal development workshops and presentations in primary and secondary schools in disadvantaged communities - from promoting positive mindsets to raising awareness of issues such as dementia and menstruation.

Raising funds and awareness for baby loss charities with a virtual walk in memory of Aveer.

Barnardo's national FGM centre and its work with local authorities to prevent female genital mutilation and support those affected.

Reaching out overseas

Hemraj Goyal Foundation continues to support projects in India and other countries that support and empower women, children and young people.

COVID-19 HIT INDIA HARD IN EARLY 2021

We started supporting Carers Worldwide and their network of more than 600 carers groups across South Asia to provide support to family carers, primarily women.

We helped more children in poverty access education through Mother Miracle School; via Child Action, we enabled more children to benefit from play with Toybank and took education to them with Doorstep School; and our sponsorship of Lily against Human Trafficking has helped more women learn skills for work and given their children education opportunities; and we have supported the British Asian Trust's Covid recovery and child protection work in India.

We partnered several other charities to fund medical equipment, drugs and PPE to help those affected by the virus. We also supported the delivery of healthy babies in Yemen through support for Red Cross.
